#### Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Advance the students' academic writing skills, with a focus on complex argumentative essays, research papers, and critical analysis.
- Expand the students' academic vocabulary and language use across different disciplines such as the sciences, humanities, and social sciences.
- Develop public speaking and presentation skills through an effective use of new vocabulary, especially in the context of presenting academic work in front of peers.

  - c. Crafting compelling introduction and conclusion paragraphs
  - d. Practicing paragraph unity
- 3. Basic Research Skills
  - a. Identifying credible sources for academic writing
  - b. An introduction to using online databases for research
  - c. Overview of basic citation styles like APA, MLA, and Chicago
  - d. Quoting, paraphrasing, and summarizing sources
- 4. Introduction to Academic Vocabulary
  - a. Learning commonly used academic words and phrases
  - b. Understanding different word forms (noun, verb, adjective)
  - c. Using context clues for vocabulary comprehension
  - d. Vocabulary quizzes and applications in writing
- 5. Building Complex Sentences
  - a. Using conjunctions to form compound and complex sentences
  - b. Integrating relative clauses for additional information
  - c. Strategies for varying sentence structure for better readability
- 6. Oral Presentation Basics
  - a. How to structure a simple yet effective oral presentation
  - b. Best practices for using visual aids like slides, graphics, and audio-visual media; the help of Al
  - c. Tips for public speaking: eye contact, body language, pace, and voice modulation
- 7. Incorporating Feedback
  - a. Methods for understanding and implementing feedback from instructors
  - b. Strategies for revising and editing one's essay and research paper
  - c. Peer-review sessions and self-assessment
