# Honorary Degree Professor Peter Kopelman

Professor Peter Kopelman was Principal of St George's, University of London from 2008 until 2015. As Principal he was instrumental in establishing the University of Nicosia Medical School in 2011, whose first offering was the St George's graduate-entry four-year Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery degree. During his tenure, the University of Nicosia Medical School and St George's signed a long-term partnership agreement and extended the relationship by offering, as concurrent awards from both institutions, a Postgraduate Diploma and Masters in Family Medicine.

Prior to his appointment to St George's in 2008, Professor Kopelman was Vice-Principal, Queen Mary, University of London and Deputy Warden of Barts & The London School of Medicine and Dentistry (2001-6), and Dean of the Faculty of Health, University of East Anglia (2006-8).

Professor Kopelman is active in health policy, education and research. He has been chair or deputy chair of several national university committees that include Universities UK's health education research policy group, UK Health Education Advisory Committee, University and Colleges Employer Association Clinical Academic Staff Advisory Group, and London Higher. He was formerly a Trustee of the University of London. He is a member of NHS national policy and workforce committees, and has chaired the Clinical Examining Board of the Royal Colleges of Physicians (UK) and the NHIR Academic Careers Panel. He is currently chair of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society Faculty Board and Health Education England's Oversight for medical associate practitioners.



Professor Kopelman has a long-standing interest in diabetes care, nutrition and obesity with a major research interest in obesity. He was a member of the UK Department of Health and Food Standards Agency Scientific Advisory Committee on Nutrition (2001-10), DH Expert Panel on Obesity (2008-10) and was Science Adviser to the Office of Science and Innovations Foresight Obesity Project (2005-9). He has published extensively on obesity, edited textbooks on the condition, and chaired a number of Working Parties on obesity and nutrition for the Royal College of Physicians of London. He is past President of the European Association for the Study of Obesity. His contribution to higher education and medicine is recognised by the University of London through the award of an honorary Doctor of Science (Medicine).

This degree was awarded in May 2016 and is being accepted in person by Professor Kopelman this year.

# Honorary Degree Professor Zeev Rotstein

Professor Rotstein, a Board certified cardiologist and expert in health care management, was appointed Director General of Hadassah Medical Organisation in Israel last year.


Before his appointment to Hadassah, Professor Rotstein worked at the Sheba Medical Center at Tel Hashomer, Israel for almost 37 years. He served as Director of Sheba's Acute Care Hospital, as a Senior Cardiologist in Sheba's Heart Institute, and as Director General for 12 years, from 2004 to 2016. As Director General of Sheba Medical Center, Professor Rotstein was instrumental in the founding of the first medical school in Cyprus and establishing the collaboration between the University of Nicosia Medical School, Sheba Medical Center and St George's, University of London for delivering the first medical degree in Cyprus, the St George's MBBS Graduate Entry programme.

Professor Rotstein trained in Medicine at the Sackler School of Medicine, in Tel Aviv University, and has held fellowships at the New York Department of Health, Tufts University, and Johns Hopkins Medical Center School of Hygiene and Public Health. He is also a clinical faculty member in the Graduate School of Epidemiology, Preventive & Occupational Medicine in the Sackler School of Medicine at Tel Aviv University.

Professor Rotstein is credited with almost 100 original publications, abstracts and case studies in scientific and professional journals. In addition to being a specialist in health policy, Professor Rotstein plays a vital role in the education of physicians and other health professionals, and in developing medical institutions around the world.



Professor Rotstein has received numerous honours and awards in recognition of his creativity, persistence and significant contribution to public health in Israel, to medical research and to medical education.
